**Author:** Lewis Carroll

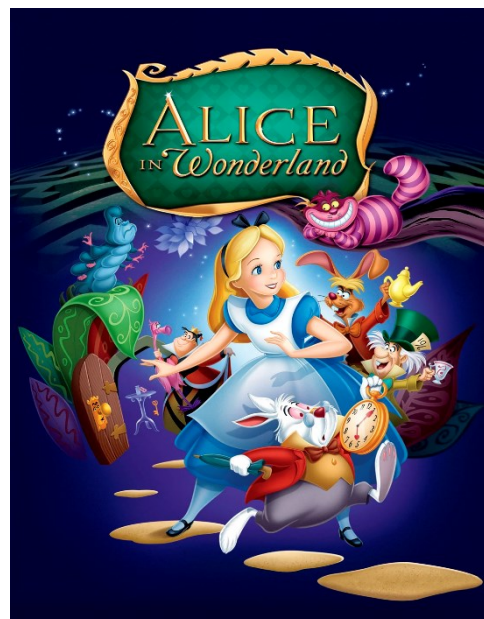
**Genre:** Fantasy / Adventure / Classic Children's Literature
