The bar chart illustrates the Bikes Preference among a group of students, with the Number of students on the Y-axis (ranging from 0 to 25) and the different bike brands on the X-axis.

* Honda is the most preferred bike brand, chosen by 24 students.

* Yamaha is the least preferred bike brand, chosen by 14 students.

* Hero is the second most popular choice, preferred by 19 students.

* Bajaj is preferred by 19 students, the same number as Hero.

* TVS is the third most popular brand, with 17 students preferring it.

Overall, the chart clearly shows that Honda is significantly more popular than the other four brands among the surveyed students.
